\$1,250,000 for Illinois Bicyclist within 30 Days

On a clear summer morning, an Illinois resident was riding his bicycle when tragedy struck. An inattentive driver ran into him as he passed a parking lot. Unaware he had stuck someone, the motorist kept driving. The driver was eventually flagged down by witnesses after traveling some distance down the street.

The bicyclist was left with severe injuries and scarring from the incident. Hupy and Abraham, S.C. demanded the \$1,250,000 policy limits be tendered within 30 days, and the insurance company paid.

Seven Signs of Nursing Home Abuse and Neglect

Nursing homes serve an important purpose by caring for those who can no longer care for themselves. While many assisted living facilities do an admirable job, the ones that don't put their residents, and potentially your loved one, at risk.

- Falls
- Avoidable bedsores
- Dehydration or malnourishment
- Failure to prescribe proper medication
- Failure to notify a physician or family member of a change in condition

- Failure to monitor the resident
